香港公共圖書館藉着六十周年,邀請了六十位愛書人,在「60種閱讀人生」影片系列中分享他們的答案。影片系列 共分三集,主題包括「閱讀/生活日常」、「閱讀/創作靈感」及「閱讀/更多可能」。喜歡閱讀的你,或許能夠從 中找到共鳴;還未與書結緣的你,或許可以找到嘗試打開書本的原因。





一樹(作家) Leo Tsang (Author)


陳脪文(滑浪風帆運動員) Haley Chan (Windsurfer)







《夢有多遠,心就要多強大:築夢進行曲 Ⅱ》是《築夢進行曲系列》的第二集,書 中九位築夢者來自不同的成長背景。雖然 他們在各自築夢的軌跡上,有着不同的掙 扎和領悟,但是有一點卻是共通的:儘管 追尋夢想的跑道並不平坦,路上總有絆石 叫人氣餒和放棄,他們還是堅持信念,勇 敢前行。

夢想並不一定純粹是個人的追求,它可以 成就別人的幸福。家境清貧的靜芬自小希 望長大後跟媽媽環遊世界,能令媽媽得到 快樂就是她的夢想。另一邊廂,即使音樂 人紀遠在生計與音樂創作夢之間掙扎,他

書名: Super!!! dad jokes: saving the world, one bad joke at a time 著者: Jimmy Niro 索書號:828 NIR



Dad jokes, which may have their origin in America, are usually told by fathers to their children, probably in the presence of other family members under a congenial home environment. The jokes typically use a play on words, presented as one or two sentences, a short story or a question and answer, so as to foster father-and-child relations.

'Super!!! dad jokes : saving the world, one bad joke at a time' written by Jimmy Niro is a collection of over 500 delightful and ridiculous jokes including puns, stories and anti-jokes on topics from sports and nature to food and entertainment and everything in between. It is a work of humour and highly entertaining.

Some of the jokes in this book are puns, a type of wordplay wherein words similar in meaning, sound or spelling are exploited to achieve a humorous or comical effect.

There are two main types of puns in this book. A homophonic pun plays with words that have similar pronunciation but different meanings and spellings. For example, the joke 'Q: Why did the giraffe break up with her boyfriend? A: He was a cheetah' is a homophonic pun because the word 'cheetah' sounds like 'cheater'. A homographic pun involves words or phrases that have identical spellings but different meanings. For example,

the joke 'The sun doesn't need to go to college. It already has twenty-eight million degrees' is a homographic pun because the word 'degrees' can mean either temperature or academic qualification. The puns covered in this book are either homophonic, homographic or both, which will certainly give you some hearty laughs.

This book also contains a number of short stories and jokes that will make you grin. As a librarian, the one that impresses me the most is this antijoke 'Q: What do you call someone whose job it is to separate fact from fiction? A: A librarian'. An anti-joke is often hilarious and it intends to derive humour from an intentionally unfunny punchline.

'Super!!! dad jokes' is an enjoyable and undemanding read aimed at a general audience. A special feature of this book is that those words involved in the wordplay of a joke are highlighted in bold for readers to catch the jokes more easily. Most of the jokes in the book are outlandish and

silly, perfect for making anyone's day happier and better. Taking a break from the stress of life by reading this book may brighten up your day and lighten your

A HISTORY OF MAGIC

Who will you think of when we talk about Wizard? Gandalf in 'The Lord of the Ring', or Merlin in the legend of King Arthur? No matter who you recall, I am sure you have heard of his name -Harry Potter! Harry Potter, the fictitious character created by J.K. Rowling, has become so famous that almost everyone would have heard of the name even if he/she has never read the novels nor watched the movies. Since the birth of its first book in 1997, the Harry Potter series has been breaking records. More than 500 million copies have been sold all over the world, and its stories have been translated into over 80 different languages.

How did J.K. Rowling, the author of the Harry Potter series, create such a masterpiece? What is the thinking and writing process of the great novelist? Are there any hidden secrets in the magical world? Did the characters just pop up in her mind out of thin air? To answer these questions and to celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the first Harry Potter book, the British Library organised an exhibition of 'Harry Potter, A History of Magic' from Oct 2017 to Feb 2018. Accompanied the exhibition and curated by the British Library, this book, 'Harry Potter: A Journey through a History of Magic', takes us on a magical journey to explore the extraordinary facts behind the Harry Potter magic.

First of all, if you are a fan of Harry Potter, this book will definitely give you a real thrill. Through the images and descriptions of Harry Potter's artefacts shown on the book, readers can acquire more magical knowledge, such as the functions of broomsticks, and the characteristics of mermaids and dragons. Besides, the book gives readers clues on how various characters

are imagined and created. For example, Fluffy comes from Cerberus which guarded the gates to the Underworld in Greek mythology; Aragog is associated to the bird-eating spider; the idea of half-giant Hagrid may probably come from the legends of giants. Meanwhile, not all elements in the novels come from myths. For example, the bezoar stones, which could save one's life from poisoning in the novels, really do exist and can be found in the stomach of some animals in reality. With colorful pictures and drawings along with an array of fun facts, this book is also suitable for young adults who can learn to link their imagination with their daily observation to boost creativity.

Apart from the above, the book shows a lot of precious manuscripts of J.K. Rowling. The crossing and notes on her handwritten drafts, as well as various sketches, allow readers to visualise her thinking and writing process. For example, for the plots of sorting students into different houses in Hogwarts School, J.K. Rowling listed out different ways such as ghost courts, gateways, selection from team captains, and of course, the sorting hat with sketches and notes. Furthermore, readers will definitely be surprised about J.K. Rowling's plans for 'Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix' shown on the book, in which detailed plots and storylines were clearly written and scheduled.

Come and borrow the book. Or if you prefer to visualise the magical contents, book yourself into a multimedia workstation in a library and watch the video of 'Harry Potter: a history of
