I have read a philosophical novel called "For One More Day" by Mitch Albom. What would you do if you could see a loved one whom you have lost again? How would you spend the day with him?

The protagonist, Charles "Chick" Benetto, experiences a life of misery because his father deserted the family when Chick was young. Only his mother supports him but he has never stood up for her. Soon after he has grown older, he decides to end his life. When he becomes unconscious, he sees his dead mother alive and accompanies her for a day to visit her friends who are about to face death. As the day is about to end, they visit an old woman in her bedroom. Chick finally understands that his father had another family earlier, and that was mainly why he'd left Chick's family. His mother still forgave his father and supported him although she knew what had happened. The last words of his mother also made Chick forgive his own past. That day, Chick understood how important forgiveness was. Finally he survived and kept the valuable lesson he'd learnt in his heart.

In this book, the words are highly descriptive. For example, "I couldn't look at her, so I looked at my feet." Readers could tell that Chick was embarrassed and guilty as he didn't want to look at his mother. Another example is "She squeezed the corn puffs and they crumbled into floury dust", which can show that Chick's mother was miserable and stressed, and the action of squeezing the corn puffs is a sign of expressing her pent-up sadness.

I have learnt a lot from this heart-stirring book. This novel reminds us of one simple virtue: forgiveness. Death itself is not dreadful; the most dreadful thing is not being able to release the grudges in one's heart before facing death. I strongly recommend this book to you; it is a must-read!
