

Have you ever dreamt of travelling around the world to learn about world culture? Whether it's Ethiopia, Ireland, or Maldives, 'The Not-For-Parents Travel Book' contains countless pieces of intriguing information, introducing exotic attractions and fun facts. Most importantly, it is a book uniquely written for children to reveal many interesting bits in the world's 200 countries!

The book starts in North America. I was most impressed by the culture of Mexico. People there celebrate the Day of the Dead in November, where the deceased arise to give us their salutations. It is not spooky at all! Instead, it is a joyous day where people prepare food, treats, and flowers to welcome their expired friends and family.

It moves on to South America. Uruguay is often addressed as the 'Switzerland of South America' as it is so peaceful. People there dress up in their traditional gaucho outfits to celebrate Tacuarembó — a cowboy festival.

Following South America, the book introduces Europe. Five hundred years ago, carrots used to be all sorts of colors, including black, red, purple, and white, until the Dutch bred them orange for the House of Orange, their royal family. Additionally, the Hungarians ground dried pepper into paprika to flavor their favorite dish — goulash.

The Cape Verdians dry calabash gourds to make musical instruments, the Gambians use melons to make koras, stringed instruments, and the Senegalese play the sabar, a traditional drum. This book allowed me to understand the musical culture of Africa.

The sports in Asia shown in the book opened my eyes. The Thai played super-sized polo using elephants. Moreover, in Afghanistan, there is a game called Buzkashi, where the players have to throw a disembowelled goat while galloping on a horse, like polo. This may be the world's weirdest sport!

Last but not least is Oceania. The grotesque culture of Vanuatu existed until 1969, where humans were eaten! The Cambodians eat fried tarantulas which are crispy outside and gooey inside.

This informative book broadened my horizons on the world's culture in a fun and interesting way. While this book may not provide the conventional information on good coffee shops or cozy hotels adored by our parents, it does bring us, curious children, facts about sights from different countries around the world! Without hesitation, I therefore highly recommend this book to you.

'This Is My World' is jointly written by children from 84 cities. Tales of the lives they lead come to life, and you'll find yourself more intrigued with every page you flip.

Hong Kong is a bustling city with lots of cars zooming around and skyscrapers reaching exceptional heights, similar to places like Chicago and London. Countries in Northern Europe, like Norway and Greenland, are a stark contrast. From glistening greenery in the sunshine and sounds of seabirds in spring, to an exquisite white canvas in December, these tranquil and relaxed places catch my eye. Unlike our fast-paced lifestyle, people there are laid-back and get the time to enjoy the lovely environment they live in.

The book also teleports us to more quirky places as we flip through the pages. Kids there share with us their surprising daily lives—greeted by herds of elephants and hippos lazily strolling by in Nandumbo, having sloths and kinkajous as neighbours in Costa Rica, and going ice fishing in Alaska! I believe being one with the wilderness and nature has inspired locals to respect their environment and animal species within.

But of course, the world isn't all sunshine and rainbows. Places like Uganda have been war-wrecked. Many families, like Esther's, had to rebuild their lives with the help of humanitarian groups. Yousef, a boy who fled from Syria with his family during the war, lives in a refugee camp with limited living and play space. Nevertheless, they are staying positive, appreciating the family life they have and the education they are given. I'm grateful to live in a place where I'm assured that war will not happen. I learned from them that we should stay positive and believe in ourselves.

I'm touched by the children in the book and the stories that form their culture and daily lives. I also feel that although we have different backgrounds, we share some similarities - we all wear big smiles, find school full of fun, love our families and friends, and like to play with animals. Eating, laughing and having fun in the outdoors are moments we treasure as well! I hope to visit these special cities one day and get a taste of what the kids experience!



Topic Exploring Global Culture: Insight From "The Usborne Book of Peoples of the World"



"The Usborne Book of People of the World" explores cultures across continents, revealing diverse lifestyles and beliefs. The book highlights the difficulty of adapting to different cultures and the importance of mutual understanding to avoid conflicts.; for example, South Americans may worship Native American gods or Christianity, while Thais practice Buddhism.

The book kept me involved and I felt as if I was travelling across the different places the book introduced. The different cultures are distinctive, each with its own uniqueness. For example, Brazilian people celebrate "Carnaval" (the Brazilian spelling of carnival), whereas people in America celebrate Thanksgiving. From the book, I learn to respect each other, as every culture is created by our ancestors, and deserves to be valued and esteemed. For example, in China, we celebrate Chinese New Year in February every year. People decorate their homes with symbols of good luck. This is the Chinese tradition, and we are still celebrating this festival which is passed from generation to generation.

The book also explores the vast array of religious beliefs and rituals, particularly in Asia, where hundreds of religions and rituals exist. In India, some follow Hinduism, while others believe in spirits of plants or animals. Many Asians engage in regular chanting, praying, or singing, demonstrating cultural diversity that can influence economic development or lead to conflicts.

The book also provides insights into the differences between urban and rural lifestyles and the various ways people make a living, such as growing food in rainforests versus buying it in crowded global cities. It also discusses different governance systems, such as the hereditary leadership in some African cultures, which the I find it strange due to the exclusion of women from power.

The book is my "travel buddy", offering extensive knowledge about different cultures and the importance of respecting local customs. The next time I go to a place with a totally different culture, I will obey their customs. 




