Can you get married to a book? If I could, I would get married to the series 'The School for Good and Evil'. I first heard of the book series from a friend, who decided to lend them to me. Immediately after finishing the very first page. I fell in love. This book has played a very important role in my childhood and it taught me a lot. Whenever I felt sad or happy, I read the book to get lost in the magical world of Good and Evil. The book was like a star, guiding me through dark moments. I grew with the characters and I feel like I have come a long way from Book One. All the characters, every single one of them, have taught me something different.

Every four years in the small town of Gavaldon, two children are kidnapped and taken into the surrounding woods by the School Master, who then brings them into the School for Good and Evil (a place where ordinary boys and girls are trained to be fairytale heroes or villains). As the most beautiful girl in Gavaldon, Sophie has wished all her life to be kidnapped. On the other hand Sophie's best friend, Agatha, is an ugly, black-loving loner who just wishes for an ordinary life with her cat, mother and best friend. On the day of the kidnapping, Sophie and Agatha are taken into the woods. At first, Sophie was ecstatic until pink and princess-lover, Sophie is dropped into the School for Evil and witchy Agatha into Good.

Sophie desperately attempts to change schools with Agatha, while Agatha just wants them both to go home with a risky plan, they get into the tower of the School Master, who gives them a riddle to solve in order to go home: 'What's the one thing Evil can never have, and the one thing Good can never do without?'

After a few interesting events, they find the answer - love. To prove the School Master wrong, Agatha helps Sophie get the attention of her supposed "true love" – the popular prince, Tedros of Camelot. Meanwhile, the annual 'Trial by Tale' is also coming up, where 10 best-ranked pre-villains and ten best-ranked pre-heroes are sent into the Blue Forest to fight for the class captain's crown. Sophie, gaining Tedros' trust, convinces him to team with her in the trial. However, when a demon attacks Tedros, it was Agatha instead of Sophie who saved him, leaving Tedros feeling betrayed. Tedros and Agatha slowly begin to fall for each other. Sophie, enraged, declares war on the School for Good. The School Master joins in, throwing his magical pen at Agatha, attempting to pierce her heart - until Sophie jumps into the way and blocks Agatha from getting hurt. Agatha manages to revive Sophie with her love and finally, they get to go home together.

I fell in love with this book since the very first time I picked it up. There are funny, iconic moments, vivid descriptions, and the whole new idea of a school for fairytale heroes and villains is truly intriguing. After this thrilling ride of Good and Evil, I have learned that although it may seem like it, not everything is as plain and simple as you think. For example, who would've guessed that beautiful Sophie belonged in Evil and witchy Agatha in Good? Not everything is black and white, or truth and lies. This book has made me reflect on what is 'good' and what is 'evil'. This book has been an important part of my childhood. It is my favourite book and I will always cherish it.

Over the past few years, I've read a lot of books from different authors which had left a remarkable memory as I explored further into the world of English novels, but this particular novel, A Game of Thrones, by the famous author George R. R. Martin, was the most indelible.

A Game of Thrones is the first book of the series A Song of Ice and Fire and is also the beginning of fame to Martin's career. The main characters of the story include Daenerys Targaryen, Eddard Stark, Catelyn Stark, Sansa and Arya Stark. The Iron Throne, originally belonging to the Targaryen bloodline, at that time, Mad King Aerys, who was Daenerys' father. King Targaryen was slain by Jaime Lannister at the King's Landing, where Robert Baratheon, took the Iron Throne before Jaime could. Basically, everything in the land of the fictional world of Westeros was chaos after the murder of the king at the hands of his trusted knight, Jaime. Now that Robert had claimed the Throne that ruled the seven kingdoms, he invited his best friend, Eddard Stark of Winterfell, to become the Hand of the King, who advised the king in times of war. Eddard Stark was the husband of Catelyn Stark, the father of Sansa, Arya Stark and others. When received the position as the King's Hand, he rode to the King's Landing with his two daughters, leaving his other sons behind with his wife. On the other hand, Daenerys Targaryen, a 14 years old maiden, was forced to be betrothed to Khal Drogo, the Khal of the Dothraki, for the sake of restoring her brother, also a Targaryen, to the Iron Throne. The only way the two siblings could obtain an army was to marry Daenerys off to the Dothraki.

The book was definitely confusing at times, as there were a lot of new characters being thrown at you at the same time. It was hard to keep track of who was who, and whom they worked for. But since the book was set on such a big piece of land, I couldn't really blame them. Reading the book was like studying history, except for the fact that it included dialogues of the characters, not found in history encyclopaedias. Every action performed by the characters is well thought-out and would lead to a consequence later on in the story. Everything carried out would lead to a reasonable outcome. It also included some magic into the mix so the story isn't plain and boring. With these two elements mingled together, the story has the perfect touch of both, and I really enjoyed reading it.

Another thing I also like about the story is how unpredictable the storyline is. A character might suddenly die out of natural causes, murder, suicide or even decapitated by the orders of the king in the middle of nowhere. The character might be a minority, whom no one really bothers to care about, or a major character, one which is very important to the storyline. This makes the story so interesting and makes readers want to read on, which I think is very clever.

The best part is that of characters like Cersei Lannister, supposedly the antagonist of the story. She is a sly, ambitious and cunning woman, the twin sister of the murderer, Jaime Lannister. Even though she is the villain of the story, I can't help but admire her wits. She is always collected and calculating with every move she makes so that everything and everyone works as she wishes. She excels in manipulation and is very power-hungry. Being the wife of Robert Baratheon and the mother of Joffrey Baratheon, the heir to the Iron Throne after his father, she was the brains behind both kings, brainwashing both to do as she bid. Though she appears as a pretty blond woman in her thirties, elegant and graceful in her colourful satin dresses, behind her mask from the public is a cruel and heartless monster that does not hesitate to kill. I'm not saying what she does is correct, but I do look up to her for being so strong at times when her family needed her most, even though she did try to kill her baby brother, Tyrion, once, but other than that, I do look up to her for being so calm and tranquil.

Do you always think that you are unlucky, but don't you know that the black people in the 1920s were unluckier? At that time, in the south of America, there were 'Whites Only' signs everywhere. Blacks could not go into many hotels, restaurants and stores. Blacks could not even drink out of the same water fountains as whites. In many cities, blacks had to ride at the back of a bus. If they tried to sit at the front, they were thrown in jail. And if black people wanted to go to a movie theater, they had to sit way up the balcony. There was a man, who is black, spent his whole life to help his race to gain freedom and was finally shot dead. This man is called Martin Luther King, Jr., and I have just read a book about him, which is called 'Who was Martin Luther King, Jr.?'

Young Martin had a very happy home life, and there was a lot of love in his family. However, Martin had an unhappy childhood memory. One of Martin's good friends was white. The boys had known each other since they were three years old. Martin and the boy were always together. But when they turned six, they started school. Martin went to a school for black children. The boy went to a school for white children. One day the boy's father told his son that he could no longer play with Martin. Martin ran home and cried to his mother. It was the end of the friendship. The night at dinner, the family had a long talk. This was the first time that Martin realized how white people felt about black people. Even so, his parents told Martin not to hate white people, and it was his duty as a Christian to love everyone. Martin's mother told him that he was important though the outside world was telling him he was not.

 The efforts Martin put into combating racial inequality was well exemplified.

As Martin grew up, he became more and more aware of the problems facing black people. When Martin was fifteen, he graduated from high school. That summer, he worked in the north of America. He was surprised to see how different life was for blacks in the North. Black and white children went to the same schools. There were no separate restaurants. Martin dreamed that this could happen in the South, too. Martin therefore knew that he wanted to spend his life helping black people. He knew that life in the North was easier and fairer for blacks, but he and his wife decided to live in Alabama - the South. Because he could help fix some of the problems of local black people there. On December 1, 1955, a black woman was arrested because she sat down in a seat at the front of a bus. In order to help the black woman, Martin asked all the black people to boycott the city buses. Martin succeeded, and the blacks could sit wherever they wanted. He made sure every adult citizen was allowed to vote, and he joined the protestors on the march, even if he was kicked off buses, and out of stores. He believed that the protestors should always behave peacefully, and should be ready to accept punishment for disobeying the laws. Martin showed people all over the world the power of words, not fists.

The story of Martin touched my heart, not only because he did his best to fight for the civil rights of black Americans. It is also because he sacrificed all his time with his family to help others. When Martin said of his wife, he said, "I am indebted to my wife, without whose love, sacrifices, and loyalty neither life nor work would bring fulfillment." In 1964, Martin was awarded the Nobel Peace Prize. He gave away all the prize money – fifty-four thousand dollars – to civil rights groups. He hoped that people would remember him as a man who 'tried to give his life serving others'. He wanted to be remembered for helping 'to feed the hungry' and for loving people. Martin is kind. He is brave, and he is selfless. I am sad that he was shot to death at the end, and I believe that his story can touch everyone's heart.

Defy the Fates is the last book of Claudia Gray's trilogy, Constellation. This story covers the adventures, hardships and beauty of a budding romance while also capturing the aspects of a sci-fi world and a journey of fighting for one's beliefs. Our main characters, Naomi Vidal, a fighter pilot on the planet Genesis, and Abel, the most sophisticated warrior robot ever made, travel across the stars searching for each other while also being targeted and facing the danger of war.

I admire how Claudia Gray fearlessly covers the topics of terrorism and religion in different perspectives throughout the book, letting readers gain insight to these sensitive and deep issues. I was intrigued by the themes and found myself being able to gain a broader outlook. It was a wonderful experience being able to wonder with Abel on whether a god exists or not and also struggling with Naomi on her disbeliefs on the religious teachings of Genesis. There were also Ephraim and Riko, both of whom, despite fighting for the same reasons, have completely different viewpoints on the methods they should use to free themselves from Earth's rule. Ephraim wanted to solve things peacefully but Riko believed that terrorism was the only way Earth would take them seriously and pay them attention. These opposing stances were stimulating and eye-opening, catching my attention and making me more engaged in the story. This really helped me connect and learn more about the real world too.

I was also extremely captivated by Claudia Gray's thoughts and concepts on the soul, the idea of creating a soul, trapping it in a mech body, experimenting on it, destroying it and restoring it. The dilemma of whether something with a soul deserves free will and rights or if it is morally correct or incorrect to force our will on them and experiment on them when we have created them. It was all so imaginative and creative, we don't know much about the concept of our "souls" but being able to conjure a story about how a lifeless robot develops a soul and forms emotions is extraordinary. These concepts deepened the plot and explains a lot of the characters' motivations and developments. It weaves the whole storyline together delicately while also providing a strong basic foundation for the whole story to be built on.

One of the things I respect most about this book is the well-developed character designs. Even though our main characters live in fictional worlds, countered with their own seemingly impossible other-dimensional situations, Claudia Gray is able to portray them as human, facing challenges of their own. It makes the characters so much more relatable and realistic, making them have their own set of strengths and weaknesses. Their feelings, desires, fears, doubts, goals and questions about the world and themselves are understandable and resonate with me deeply, driving a more profound connection between the characters and myself. Naomi and Abel both have a strong sense of individual self and both have clear purposes, although these may have wavered at times. It is inspiring to watch them strive to achieve their goals and at times when they seem to lose sight of their purpose, they will always find the motivation to stand back up and continue chasing their dreams. It's incredible how an unfeeling, lifeless robot like, Abel, who once had no soul, came alive slowly because of love, and was able to find his own sense of self.

The scenes in the book were described in detail and there were a lot of carefully chosen words in each sentence that helped appeal to our senses and feelings. The way everything was worded is beautiful and fascinating. Just like the way that the author expresses love as a kind of rule put up above all others, like a Directive One set in our programming.

Overall, I think Defy the Fates is a masterpiece that is enthralling, beautiful and creative. It has a well-written plot, tear-jerking scenes, heart-stopping cliffhangers, breath-taking plot twists, three-dimensional characters, thought-provoking theories and alluring art in the form of written text. It is definitely one of the best books I've read so far and it seems that it will stay that way for a long time to come.
